5. Thierry Neuville (BEL) / Nicolas Gilsoul (BEL) (Hyundai i20 Coupé WRC)
I can only do what I have in my hands. I struggle with the handling. I tried but I'm pretty sure we cannot get a lot of points with that.

6. Hayden Paddon (NZL) / Sebastian Marshall (GBR) (Hyundai i20 Coupé WRC) It's so slippery. Unbeliveable how slippery it is. Almost more slippery than Monte Carlo. The pacenotes were not working right. Thierry was off the road a lot.

4. Andreas Mikkelsen (NOR) / Anders Jaeger (NOR) (Hyundai i20 Coupé WRC) It's hard to have a really good stage. I was feeling really bad yesterday so I didn't do any video training for this stage. Not a perfect stage at all but we're here.

10. Mads Ostberg (NOR) / Torstein Eriksen (NOR) (Citroen C3 WRC)

9. Esapekka Lappi (FIN) / Janne Ferm (FIN) (Toyota Yaris WRC) It was an OK run. So many surprised and the road is quite narrow. We followed the line from the others. It's impossible to keep it on the road as the grip is changing so much. I wouldn't mind if we didn't do the second run!

7. Jari-Matti Latvala (FIN) / Miikka Anttila (FIN) (Toyota Yaris WRC)

I can tell you, it was an extremely didifficultff stage. to push in these conditions there is very low grip, there is mud and everything. At one point I was sideways and flat over a crest and I thought I was going to hit something but I didn't. I was lucky.
