4. Esapekka Lappi (FIN) / Janne Ferm (FIN) (Citroen C3 WRC)

Have to focus stage by stage and do the best we can with each one. It all looks the same this morning but still quite changeable.

11. Thierry Neuville (BEL) / Nicolas Gilsoul (BEL) (Hyundai i20 Coupe WRC)

I struggled at the beginning, I was too careful at the start of the stage, I tried to get the feeling. It was a long day yesterday, short night, I should have done better.

5. Kris Meeke (GBR) / Sebastian Marshall (GBR) (Toyota Yaris WRC)

I didn't explore the grip enough, there was more grip than I expercted. You get it from the first corner and go or you hesitate a bit. But OK. We have to try everything, Thierry is driving a Hyundai and we have to get in front. We have some work to do.

8. Ott Tänak (EST) / Martin Järveoja (EST) (Toyota Yaris WRC) The grip was OK, I couldn't go to the limit but the car feels good.

24. Jan Kopecky (CZE) / Pavel Dresler (CZE) (Skoda Fabia R5 Evo)

We have to stay on the road and bring this car to the finish. I know you can go very fast on these stages but on this one I have no experience so it's good to keep the pace down and get to the finish.
